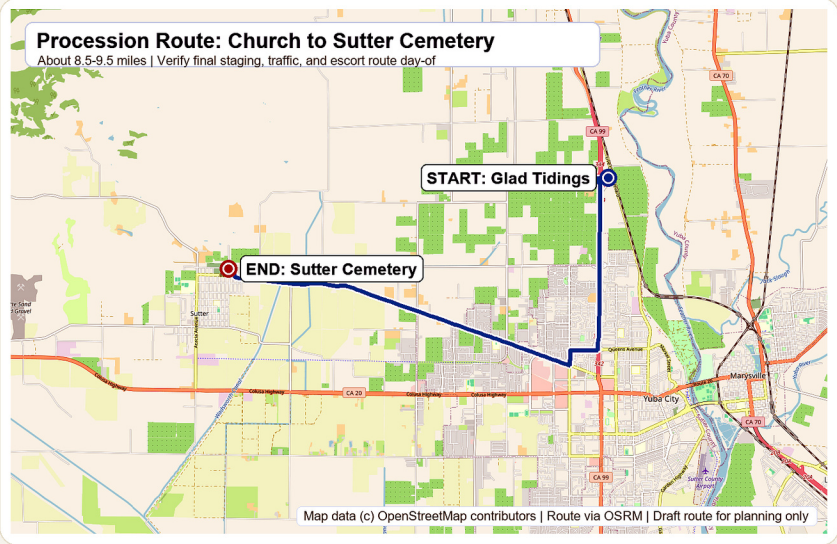

Procession route

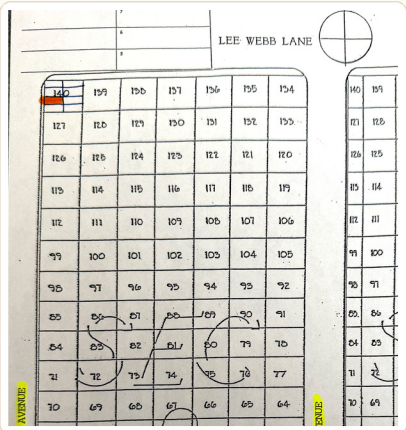

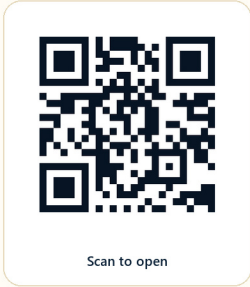

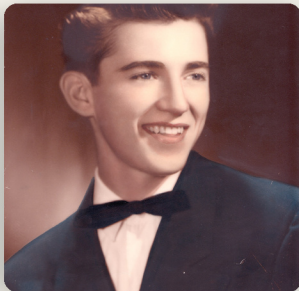
Prayer for Farmers

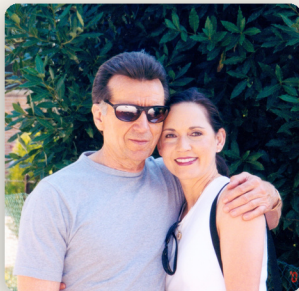
